The Francis Pettitt Competition was unfortunately not held through lack of entries and we sincerely hope that members will support this competition next year.

The Chairman announced a proposal from the Committee to make slight amendments to the Cup regulations for subsequent years. The George Pearson Competition regulation 3, will now read 'Each entry shall be of 16 standard sheets' and that regulation 9, shall read 'any philatelic material up to 3.9.1939.' These were approved. Likewise in the Francis Pettitt Competition, regulation 3, shall read "Each entry shall consist of 12 standard sheets". This also was approved, and these amendments will appear in the new Handbook.

A further proposal from Mrs Goodman, seconded by Mr Smith, that the minimum number of entries for each competition should be reduced from six to five, was also approved and will be incorporated into the forthcoming Handbook.

### CORRIGENDA

Your Editor regrets an error in the Introductory paragraph of John Whiteside's paper on "Internal Postage Rates" in Czechout 4.83. The second sentence should conclude 'principally the various changes in the printed matter rate that occurred more frequently than the other rates.'

CZECH POSTAGE RATES by John L. Whiteside FRPSL - Amendments

Internal rate table, 1918-1939 - Period 28/10/1918 to 14/5/1919. The Express fee should be .60 instead of .30. It is shown as .30 in the original reference used (the 1978 Specializovany Katalog), but other references show .60 and I have two covers showing a rate of .60 paid.

Internal rate table, 1918-1939 - Footnote D on Business Printed Matter (0.1).

The last sentance should conclude "up to a maximum weight of 300g."

Foreign Postage Rates - Period 28/10/1918 to 14/5/1919.

Under the Reduced rate column, the words 'not applicable' should be deleted.

Our Norwegian member, Paul Jensen, has kindly pointed out that the Czech Republic maintained the old Austrian Imperial Rates whereby internal rates applied to all parts of the old German - Austrian Postal Union, i.e. all the old Austro-Hungarian Empire and Germany.

Effectively, therefore, footnote No. 1 applies to this period also.

# UMĚNÍ A ZNÁMKA by Alan J. Knight

There can be few countries which have not at some time or other taken pride in exposing to mankind's wondering gaze some of the treasured works of art which forms part of their national heritage. International Exhibitions are the usual form for such propaganda but few of us can travel world-wide in order to feast our eyes on such wonders. Of course one can usually visit a local gallery or museum but then the scope is usually limited and the subjects few.

There remains an alternative and very much cheaper way by which one can view (on a smaller scale albeit) the art treasures of Czechoslovakia — through stamps issued annually which deal specifically with this subject. I refer of course to the regular series "UMĚNÍ A ZNÁMKA" (Art and Stamps). Like many other countries, Czechoslovakia takes great (and justifiable) pride in its art treasures; held mainly in the National Galleries of Prague and Bratislava (the Slovak Capital) but few countries indeed can match the technical skills required in order to produce such accurately detailed miniscule reproductions of some of these pictures and works of art in the form of postage stamps.

The purists will say that postage stamps should be simply utilitarian pieces of paper showing the pre-payment of postages, but what is wrong with making these as attractive as is technically possible?

Many argue that it is technically impossible to reduce large works of art to the impossible small area of a few square millimetres of stamps. In this respect — (indeed it is my view) that Czechoslovakia has achieved almost the impossible in this direction, so much so in fact, that these stamps are now eagerly sought after worldwide by serious collectors of stamps within the theme of "Art on Stamps".

Many of these issues have commanded large sums in auctions being soon snapped up by the collectors and philatelists alike. One of the main reasons I started to collect the stamps of Czechoslovakia was for the very fact of the fine engravings on many of the stamps of this country over many years. Regularly since 1966, the ČSSR has issued special sets of some of the finest possible stamps of pictures and other works of art by indigenous and foreign artists in its series "Art and Stamps", "Prague Castle" and "Historical Motifs of Bratislava."


These are always produced by the very old method of flatbed-recess printing and always on single sheets containing four stamps. Not for these issues the usual rotary presses and miles of paper-rolls. These stamps are really "Special" issues in every way, even down to the limited numbers produced - usually under 500,000 copies per issue.

If one can obtain the use of an "aspheric" distortion-free magnifier you will be amazed by the extremely fine detail the engravers have been able to incorporate in these stamps, by countless hours of eye-searing work on plates which are then reduced to mere stamp sizes, albeit somewhat larger than the normal definitives.


I have many favourites amongst these issues but for the sake of examination I would suggest readers take a closer look at these minute works of art (for that is what they really are) by looking for example at the following few issues: SHIP ENGRAVINGS of V. Hollar and other artists in the set of 1976; the Albert Durer paintings in the 1968 Art set; the Vincenc Morstadt miniature sheet (POFIS A2333) showing Prague Old Town/Charles Bridge, being a detail from his picture of the same title shown in the stamp 2180 of 1975; the 3.60Kcs stamp of J. Rudolf Bys' painting in the Prague National Gallery "Bunch of Narcissi and Tulips" (POFIS 2230 of 1976) and many more.

### UMENI A ZNAMKAc'td

The latest (at the time this article was written) issue of "Art and Stamps" was the five-value set issued on 27th November 1981: The 1Kcs value shows Hollar's fine etching of Praha as he viewed it from Petrin Hill in 1636 in the company of Lord Arundel. Others in this set are as follows: Czechoslovak Academy of Science and Art (2Kčs); South Bohemian Embroidery (3Kčs); Peonies painted in 1928 by the Russian painter A.M. Gerasimov (1881-1963) illustrated, being the 4Kčs value and 'Standing Women' (5Kčs) by Picasso. The engravings were by J. Herčík and M. Ondraček respectively. Five First Day Covers were issued simultaneously with this set.

### WHAT THE PAPERS SAY

Otto Hornung's World Scene column of STAMP COLLECTING 1.12.1983 records an error on the Postal Stationery Cover issued on January 20, 1983 commemorating the 18th Olympiad of carrier pigeons. On the cover is an imprint with the face value of 6Kcs showing a pair of pigeons. Above their heads is the name of the country. Instead of CESKOSLOVENSKO, the designers or printers have slipped in a 'K' instead of the 'L' thus misspelling the name CESKOSKOVENSKO! It is reported that only some 300 of these covers were sold at the Prague post office before the error was discovered and sales were stopped. A reprint of this cover was issued but it came out early in February, that is too late for the commemorative handstamp that was in use from 28th to 31st January.





### SPECIAL AND COMMEMORATIVE POSTMARKS OF BOHEMIA & MORAVIA by Ernest G. Taylor

On the 15th March 1939 the German armed forces moved across the frontiers of Czechoslovakia, and the Protectorate of Bohemia and Moravia was declared. As it was never intended that the new entity was to become part of the German Reich Czech stamps continued to be valid, but the German presence was made felt by the use of provisional commemorative postmarks in predominately German and Austro-German towns.

The post in the Protectorate appears to have functioned without the slightest interruption and special postmarks were immediately brought into use, the first to commemorate the visit of Hitler to Prague. However, the Germans appeared to have been moderate in this approach to authorising the special stamps for in the six years of occupation only 117 regular handstamps, and 10 slogan postmarks were introduced. Many of these were of a local nature to advertise stamp exhibitions, religious festivals, and town shows, only a few having a political context. As many of these were in colour, even the old Poslusny multiple coloured marks were pressed into use, they make a bright show on our album pages.

I believe that the following lists are almost complete, and with the exception of the Gross Blatnitz (13.6.1940), the rubber Oderfurt 'Wir Sind Frei!' and the Prague Book Week slogan postmarks, I have seen every mark that I have listed. I am sure a few stamp die letters have been missed, and I would be most grateful to hear of any of them in our own members possession.
