## THE STORIES BEHIND THE STAMPS by Alan J. Knight

No: 3 J. E. PURKYNE, (SG:371-372; POFIS 322-323)

Jan Evangelista Purkyne was born in Libochovice, Bohemia on December 17, 1787 and died eighty-two years later in Prague on July 28, 1869. He was a pioneer experimental physiologist whose investigations in the fields of histology (study of fine structure of tissue), embryology and pharmacology helped create a modern understanding of the eye and vision, brain and heart function, mammalian reproduction and the basic composition of cells.

Purkyne studied at Prague University, obtaining his M.D. in 1819 and later becoming Professor of Physiology between 1850 and 1869. During this time he was responsible for the discovery of the phenomenon known as the Purkinje effect (as light intensity decreases, red objects are perceived to fade faster than blue objects of the same brightness.) His studies of human vision had by now attracted the attention of the German poet Goethe, who befriended him and was possibly instrumental in Jan Purkyne obtaining the chair of physiology and pathology from 1823 to 1850 at Breslau, Prussia (now Wroclaw, Poland). There Purkyne created the world's first official physiological laboratory - the Physiological Institute - in 1842.

J.E. Purkyne is nowadays considered as being the founder of laboratory training in connection with University teaching in Germany. He is best known for his discovery of large nerve cells with many branching extensions found in the cortex of the brain cerebellum in 1837 and of the very fine tissues that conduct the

pacemaker stimulus along the inside walls of the ventricles to all parts of the heart (Purkinje fibres: 1839). In describing the contents of young animal embryos, he introduced protoplasm as a scientific term.

Purkyne was also the first to use the microtome ( a mechanical device for slicing extremely thin tissue sections), glacial acetic acid, potassium bichromate and Canada Balsam in the preparation of tissue samples.

QUERY CORNER

Paul Jensen of Oslo writes "I have some remarks to the queries raised by Brian Jones in Czechout 1.84" There does not seem to have been published a complete list of the locations of the 1938 Field Post Offices, but I believe that quite a few have been 'located' in back issues of the "Czechoslovak Specialist."

As for the postmarks in use in Bohemia, Moravia and Silesia I can refer Brian Jones to the Monografie vols 13 and 14, which gives great details of all postmarks used up to the independence dates. Those volumes also give great details about the pre-adhesive postmarks of the same area.

QUERY CORNER c'td

Paul Jensen continues 'As for the Slovakian pre-adhesive postmarks I can refer to the work of Novotný/Preisler "Posta a postové pečiatky na Slovensku do roku 1867", published in Bratislava in 1973. This gives a good survey of all the postmarks in use up to 1867. Of course, the Müller handbook also gives good information, but the Slovakian places are all listed as Hungarian (as they rightly were) and therefore not easy to identify.

Volume 14 (as well as Wilhelm Klein) gives a good listing of the travelling post offices up to 1918 as well. For later listings, I believe that the ArGe Tschechoslowakei in Western Germany is now publishing a list of the post 1946 TPO's.'

"I enclose a photostat of a cover from China dated 14 November 1952 to London. I have never seen the handstamp (in blue/purple) "Via Czecho-Slovakia".

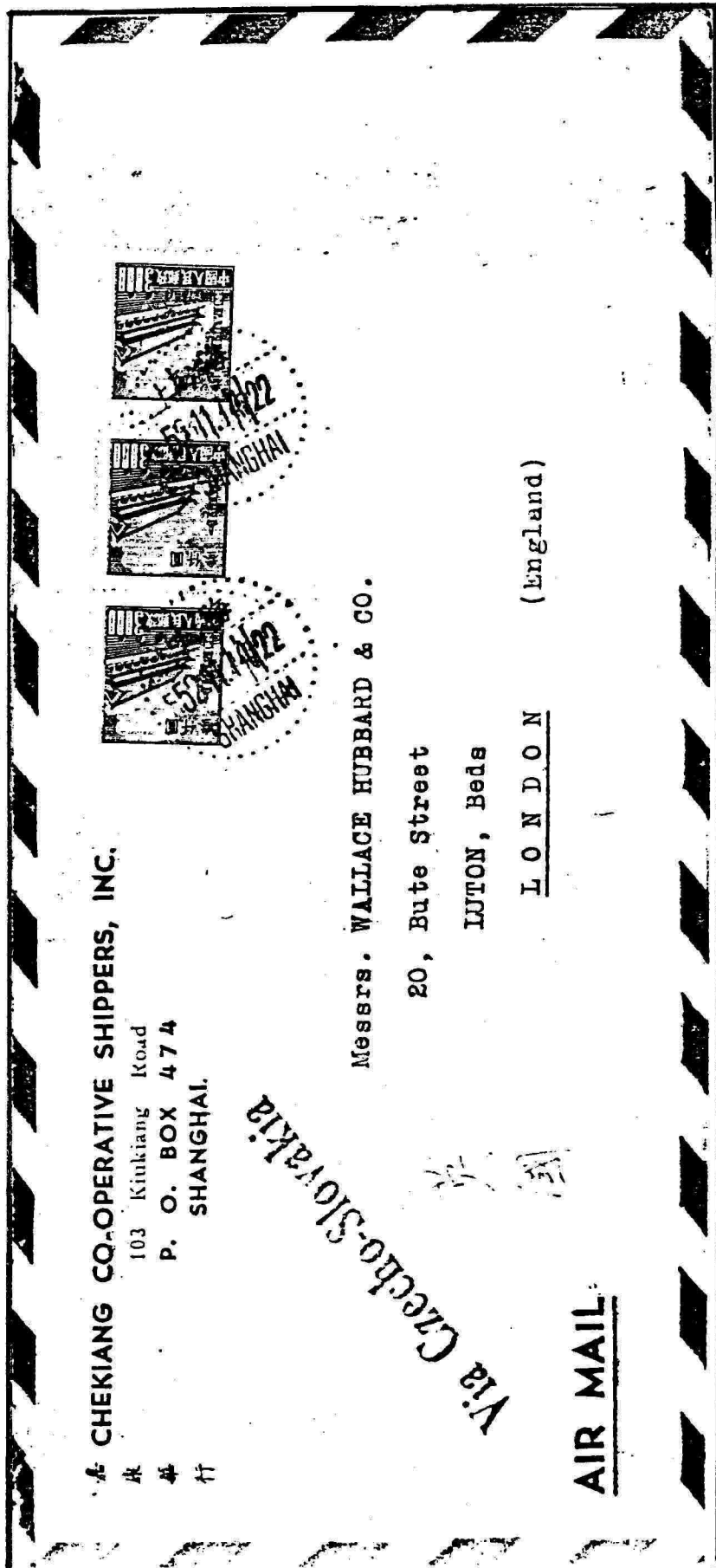
Have you any knowledge of how long this mark was in use or for how long the route was in use, or which air-lines was involved?

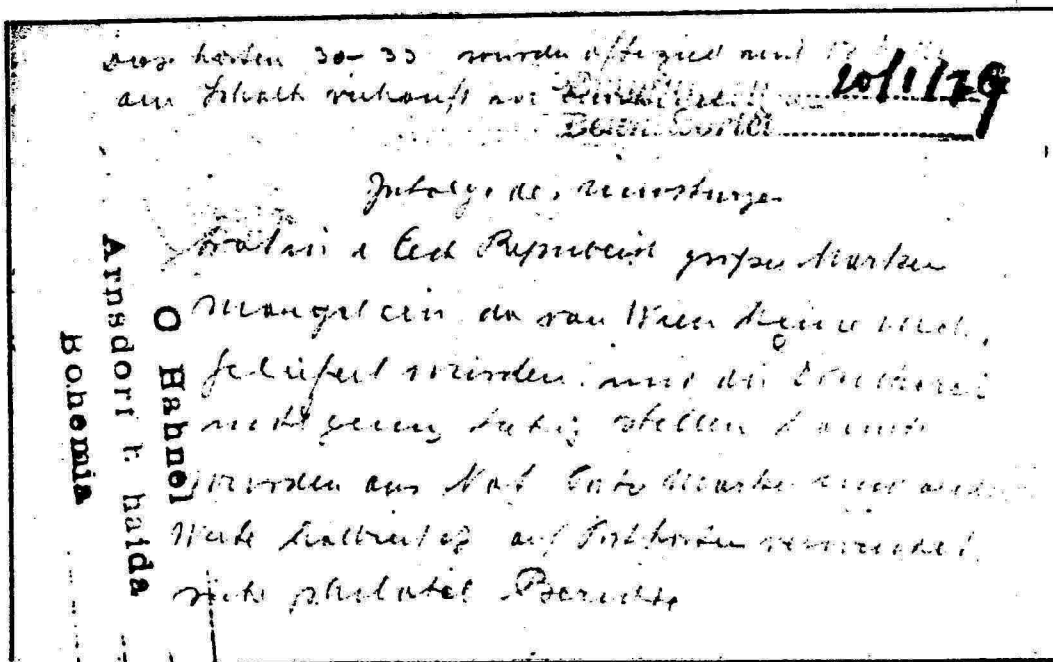
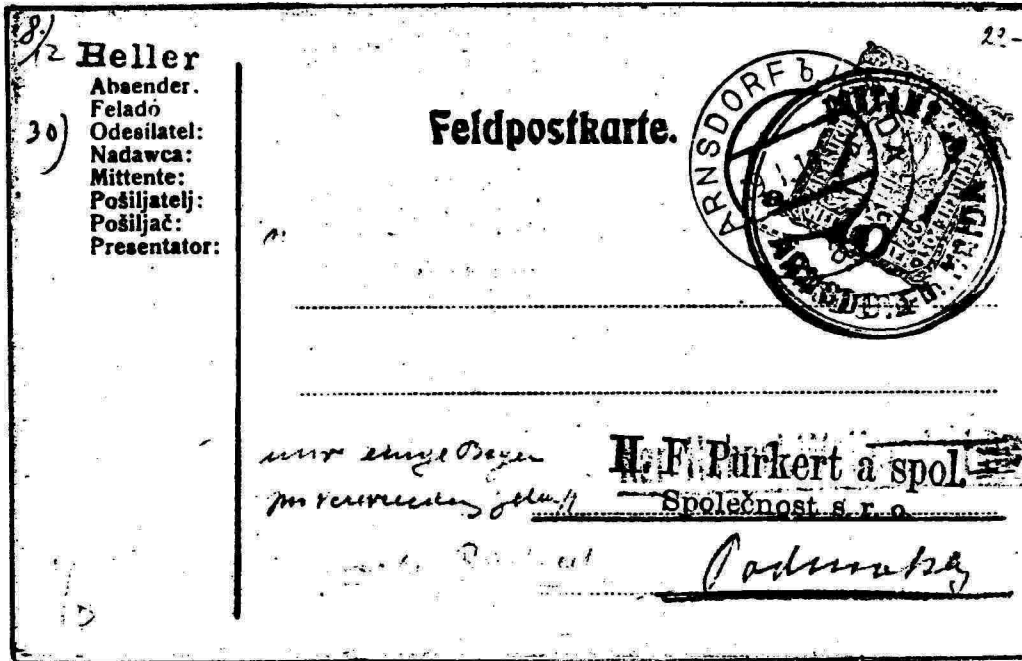

QUERY CORNER c'td

The undated Postamp mark is in purple and the double-circle postmark of ARNSDORF b HAIDA, dated 19.1.19, is in Bohemia. Although a Fieldpost Card it clearly wasn't used as such and I cannot trace the overprint - perhaps someone can throw some light upon the subject.



FIELD POST OF THE HUNGARIAN REPUBLICAN COUNCIL ARMY ON THE TERRITORY OF SLOVAKIA IN THE YEAR 1919 by Ing Jozef Teket (translated by Robert Kingsley)

The proclamation of the Hungarian Republican Council (MRR) of 21st March 1919 was the first attempt by the proletariat to take over the government in Hungary. The government of the Czechoslovak Republic had taken an unfriendly attitude to the revolutionary developments in neighbouring Hungary. On the 7th April 1919 the Ministry of Defence issued a confidential order No. 1087 to prepare for an attack against the Hungarian Republican Council, and this order no doubt had something to do with the offensive of the Romanian Army.

On the 16th April 1919 the Romanian Army began its attack against the MRR and the Czech Army joined the attack on 27th April 1919. The MRR now found itself in a difficult situation. In May 1919 the Czech Army made territorial advances

temporarily occupying Misk-olcz and advancing to Salgotarjan. In the middle of May the MRR halted the advances of Czech units and on 30th May began a fierce counter-attack on the entire front from Sturov right beyond Safarik. By the 3rd June they had occupied territory South of a line Nove Zamky - Levice - Krupina - Lucenec - Rimavska Sobota. The attack was chiefly directed towards Kosice and Bardejov. By June 10th Hungarian units had advanced to a line Marcelova - Sucany - Vrable - Zlata Moravce - Nova Bana - Zvolen - Klenovec - Plesivec - Rpnava - Gelnica - Sabinov - Bardejov - Giraltovce - Humenne - Michalovce - Cop. As a result of the severe disruptions of the positions of the Czech Army in Eastern Slovakia favourable conditions were created for the establishment of the Slovakian Republican Council in Presov on 16th June 1919. In the second half of June 1919 the Czech Army made a number of successful counter-attacks. On the 24th June the Hungarian Army faced certain territorial losses on a line Pribeta - Dvory nad Zitavou - Marcelova - Levice - Detva - Klenovec - Safarikovo - Medzev - Sabinov - Bardejov - Vranov - Kralovsky Chlmec. In these circumstances pressure built up for discussions about a truce to commence, and the Hungarian Army began its retreat on 30th June 1919. By 5th July all Hungarian units had left Slovakian territory and had taken up new positions on the demarcation line between the Czechoslovak Republic and the Hungarian Republican Council.

With the advance of the Hungarian Revolutionary Army into Southern and Eastern Slovakia during the first half of June 1919 a number of Field Post Offices were temporarily set up in Slovakia. The table shows details of their location. These Field Post Offices of the MRR left Slovakia at the beginning of July 1919 in conjunction with the retreat of Hungarian units to the demarcation line.

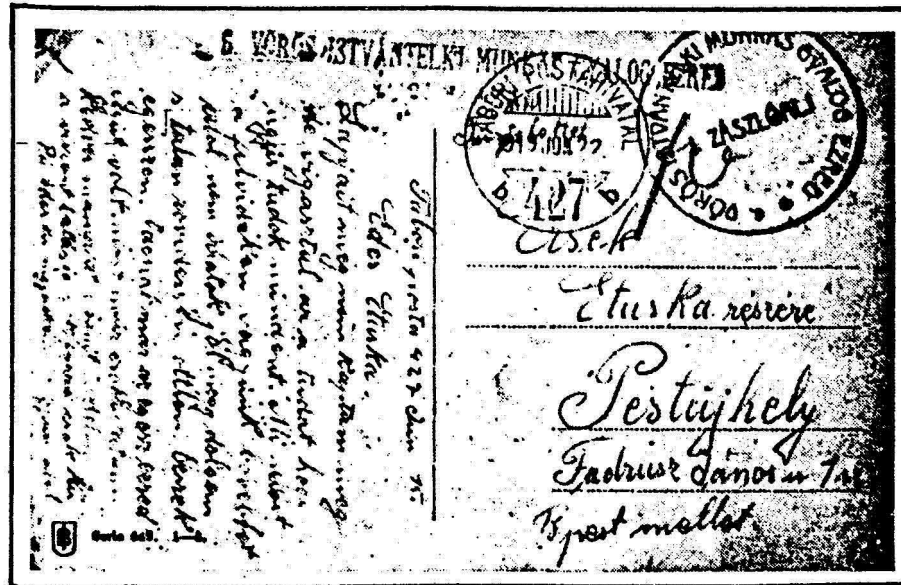
The Field Post Office of the MRR began its activities on 3rd May 1919. In the period from 3rd to 31st May 1919 the Field Post Offices of the MRR used cancellations of defunct Field Post Offices of the former Empire from the period of the 1st World War. In order to facilitate the organisation of the Republican Army Field Post the cancellations were adapted by the removal of the Field Post Office number. However, the anonymity of the cancellations made it very difficult to identify individual Field Post Offices. For this reason a number of cancellations from former Field Post Offices were brought into use from 1st June 1919 in their previous form, not having been adapted. In some cases cancellations which had had the number of the Field Post Offices removed, a new number was inserted in the first half of June 1919. It is possible to differentiate between those cancellations which had a new number inserted and those which were used in their old form by the difference in the size of the figure which was inserted. The original number was 7.5 mm high, whereas the new number is 5.5 mm high. In Slovakia an adapted cancellations was also used by Field Post Office 22. It is not known which Field Post Office this cancellation originally came from. The legendary "TABORI POSTAHIVATAL" postmark was left unchanged, the new number of the Field Post Office being inserted at the bottom of the circle. The postmark is interesting since it would appear that when the new number was inserted, a distinguishing letter was probably removed at the same time. This assumption seems to be borne out by the fact that the postmark does not have at the bottom of the circle a characteristic ornament.

The Field Post Offices of the MRR functioned in the occupied part of Slovakia for about 4 weeks. Covers which have been discovered from the period of the functioning of Hungarian Field Post Offices in Slovakia during the period of June and early July 1919 show us details of this revolutionary period.

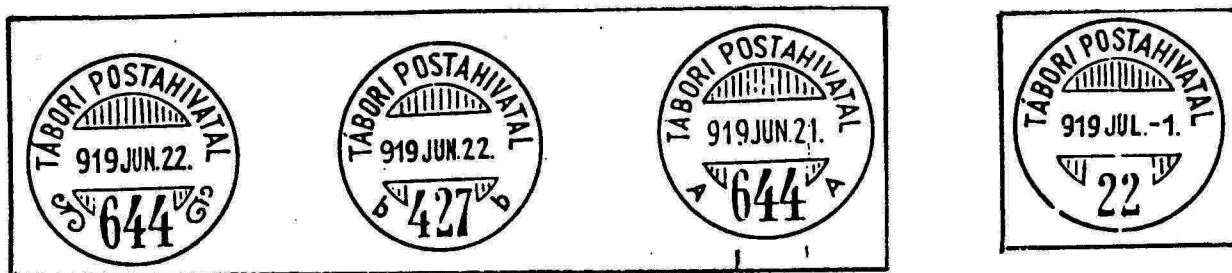

On letters from Slovakia by Hungarian soldiers one will find cancellations of Field Post Offices 22, 50, 62, 417, 422, 427 and 644. The attached catalogue lists all postmarks of these Field Post Offices. For the information of collectors and with particular reference to the possibility of new discoveries, the catalogue lists even postmarks which have so far not been found on covers from the period of the MRR.
