ANNOUNCEMENTS & NEWS

We have been shown a copy of the TIMES for June 26. 1984 which contains an Obituary for the late Professor Sir Cecil Parrott, KCMG, OBE, one-time Professor of Central & South-Eastern European Studies at the University of Lancaster, who died on June 23 aged 75. He was an authority on the culture and affairs of Czechoslovakia, and made the definitive translations into English of the works of the novelist Jaroslav Hasek.

We have received from the Library of the Philatelistische Bibliothek Munchen, one of the leading philatelic Libraries which receives a copy of our bulletin; their bibliography covering books of the sections Germany, Europe and Overseas, amongst items noted are a listing of Czech philatelic works, including those donated by the Czech PS of GB and the USA. Another interesting section contains a list of Motives/Themes covering a wide thematic area. A most useful publication nicely produced, and this was originally featured in the philatelic journal "Deutsche Zeitung fur Briefmarkenkunde' (DBZ)! The Bibliography is dated May 1983 3rd edition, and is all the books that have been dataprocessed up to that date. Member Cyril Wackett has kindly provided us with a photocopy from the original document submitted by A. Hasse to the Ministry of Posts and Telegraphs dated Prague 17 April, 1923. This Memorandum covers the proposed issue of stamps to commemorate the 500th anniversary of the Hussite Period, especially that of Jan Zizka. Details of this issue together with the illustrated prrofs were published in the Bulletin for June 1976 (No. 6). We hope to eventually publish this interesting document.

MAN AND HIS FLIGHTS INTO SPACE by H. Hoche

General

Members who attended the Leeds Meeting in September 1983 will have seen my presentation of the 12 varieties of the above miniature sheets. The differences are quite easy to distinguish. The Green Specialist Catalogue of Czechoslovak Postage Stamps describes the various differences on page 198. Other members, and those who do not read Czech, may find it useful to have a detailed description, with illustrations, in English.

The miniature sheet was issued by the Central Office of Communications on the occasion of the Exhibition 'Man and his Flights into Space' in Prague. It was printed on two Waite printing machines with two pairs of printing plates (one for each colour). Each plate contained 6 stamps of the original 1 Kes design, but with a new face value of 3Kes. An ornamental border consisting of stars and dots together with the text was engraved around each separate stamp directly onto the plate. During this extremely exacting task certain differences in the engraving were missed during the complicated printing process. This resulted in that all individual sheets contain differences in the border and text, in both colours. Some of these variations were actually noticed during the printing, but could not be corrected because of the short time between printing and date of issue.

The deviations in each set can be divided into seven groups:-

- a) Missing orange dot
- b) Missing orange star
- c) Missing orange ray
- ci) Missing green ray
- d) Shorter or longer orange ray
- di) Shorter or longer green ray
- e) Location of the letter "V" in text

The prints from each plate (1 and 2) were divided into 6 sheets, thus making a total of 12 sheets, which all differ in the details of the engraved ornamental border. These easily discerned deviations are characteristic of the whole issue. Deviations on the sets printed from Plate 1 are marked I to VI, and those from Plate 2, are marked VII to XII.

There are said to be minor errors, not detailed, which are considered of no importance. The number of sheets printed from each plate is about the same. Distribution of the sheets to the various regions throughout Czechoslovakis was made in packs of 100, each pack containing the same error. It was suggested that to obtain complete sets of 12 varieties, exchanges between philatelists from these different regions should be arranged. It is believed, however, that complete sets did find their way to dealers and were sold as such.




